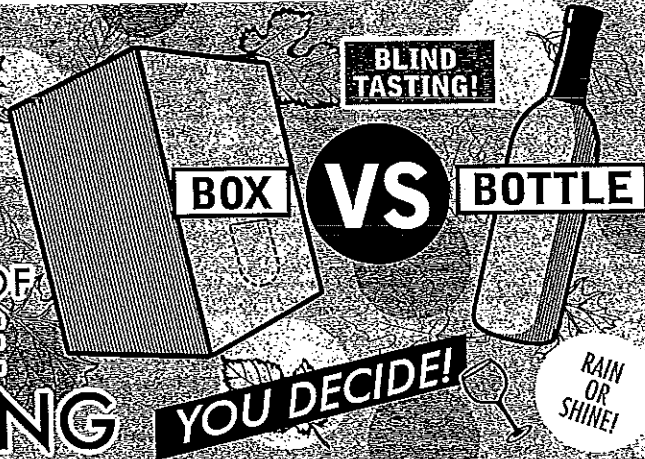

When Should I Keep My Child Home From School?

If your child is exhibiting any of the following symptoms, it is important that he/she remains home from school: fever, heavy coughing, thick nasal discharge, vomiting, diarrhea, or if he/she has a communicable or contagious disease or condition, such as chicken pox or head lice.

A Note of Excuse must be provided upon your child's return to school. If he/she was absent due to a communicable condition or contagious disease, i.e. strep throat, a note from his/her doctor is required stating the child has been treated and is safe to return to school. 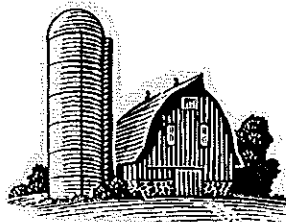

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Free And Reduced Meals (FARMS) campaign! Our participation results are still being

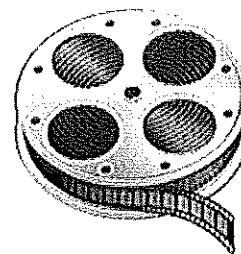
tabulated. As soon as I hear if we have reached our goal and will receive the \$3,000 for school field trips, I will report it here! Thank you, all!
